

On our recent vacation, Julie and I visited a Lutheran congregation in St. Petersburg, Florida. It was a very friendly, very welcoming congregation. It was a joy to worship with them. However, one thing stood out to us immediately ... we (at age 62) were easily the youngest people in the worship service!

I tell you this to make an important point. Much has been written in the media about the fact that the vast majority of Christian churches in America (including St. Michael) are struggling to hang onto and attract younger folks. The St. Petersburg church we visited certainly is an example of what awaits many Christian congregations if things don't change.

Ask the owner or manager of any small business these days and they will tell you that a business cannot rest on its laurels if it intends to survive, grow, and thrive in our ever-changing world. A successful business constantly explores the needs of its customer base, and then evolves to meet the needs of those customers. Churches must emulate these small business practices if they are to survive and thrive in the future.

Our St. Michael congregation has done well in the recent past. In many respects, we are a fairly healthy congregation compared to many other congregations in our area and around the country. But being healthy does not guarantee future prosperity. We must be committed to constantly evaluating the effectiveness of our current ministries. We must be willing to modify, or even shut down, those ministries that are outdated or unneeded. We must be willing to think outside the box about how to reach out to our surrounding communities and to all age groups. We must continually look for new ways to communicate the Good News and make new disciples of Jesus Christ in a constantly changing world.

To do this, we need committed leaders willing to role up their sleeves and do some hard work. We have seven open Church council leadership positions going into our February annual meeting (see descriptions of these leadership positions following this letter.) I am asking each of you to please prayerfully consider joining our church council. Come and help us chart a new future for our congregation. Together, with good leadership, we can be a congregation that bucks the trend.

Your Church Council Is Looking For Some New Members!

With the approach of the New Year, 2023, it is time to think about adding some new members to our St. Michael church council. The purpose of the church council is to carry out the wishes of the congregation with respect to ministering to our members and to our local communities. The council consists of four officers and eight ministry board chairs. Pastor Gibbs and Shawn Jennings also sit on the council.

This year seven (7) of the twelve council positions need to be filled, due to retirements and term limits of existing members. *We sincerely urge each member of St. Michael to consider volunteering to serve in one of these seven positions.* It is a privilege to serve in leadership of God's church. We are confident that you will also find it to be a spiritual growth experience as well. Nothing sharpens your faith like engaging in tangible ministry for God and Jesus, and serving on church council is one place this can happen. If you are looking for a way to make a difference in your church and community, serving on church council is a great way to do it.

Here are the council position that need to be filled in 2023:

Vice President – Assists the council president with making sure the church operates according to the wishes of the congregation, helps run council meetings, and occasionally takes on temporary assignments to accomplish specific tasks.

Christian Education Ministry Board Chair – Organize and manage the work of this board, which is primarily seeing that education ministries of our congregation are planned, staffed, and offered (Sunday School, Adult Bible classes, Confirmation ministry, Vacation Bible School).

Stewardship Ministry Board Chair – Organize and manage the work of this board, which is primarily to assist the pastor in encouraging congregation members to use their God-given gifts of time, talents, and financial resources to serve the Kingdom of God.

Evangelism & Congregational Life Minsitry Board Chair – Organize and manage the work of this board, which is two-fold: 1) offering fellowship opportunities to our members and 2) taking the Gospel of Christ outside the walls of our church to our local communities.

Worship & Music Ministry Board Chair – Organize and manage the work of this board, which is primarily to assist the pastor with carrying out the various tasks necessary to conduct the church's worship services, and help plan any special services and themes throughout the church year.

Youth Ministry Board Chair – Organize and manage the work of this board, which is primarily to assist the youth minister in planning and offering youth ministry activities throughout the year.

Social Ministry Board Chair – Organize and manage the work of this board, which is primarily to plan and offer members opportunities to serve through outreach to our local communities.

February 26 & March 5	Chapter 9 – Responding With Love




